

Chapter Fifty

Section in relation to seeking cure from the blessed urine

of the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ

1. Imam Hasan ibn Sufyan (d. 303 AH) in his Musnad, Imam Abu Ya'la (d. 458 AH), Imam Hakim (d. 405 AH), Imam Dar Qutni (d. 385 AH) and Imam Abu Nu'aym (d. 430 AH) رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهُمْ extracted a narration from Sayyidah Umm Ayman رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا who stated that the Messenger of Allah صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ went during the night towards the bowl in the corner of the house and the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ relived himself in it. I (Umm Ayman) got up during the night and was thirsty. I drank what was in the bowl. When I woke up, I informed and the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ smiled and said, "Indeed you will never ever suffer from stomach pain after today."
2. Imam Abdur Razzaq (d. 211 AH) extracted a narration from Ibn Jurayj who stated, "I was informed that the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ used to relieve himself (urine) in a bowl made of wood then it would be place under his blessed bed. The Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ came and there was nothing in it. The Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ said to a woman who is called Barakah who would serve Sayyidah Umm Habibah رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا and had come with her from the land of Abyssinia, "Where is the urine which was in the bowl?" Sayyidah Barakah رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا said, "I drank it." The Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَآلِهِ وَسَلَّمَ said, "Health, O Umm Yusuf!" She was known by the kunyah (agnomen) Umm Yusuf she never fell ill apart from the illness in which she passed away.

Imam Ibn Dihyah (d. 633 AH) stated this is a separate event other than the event of Sayyidah Umm Ayman رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا and the Barakah known as Sayyidah Umm Yusuf is separate to Barakah who is known as Sayyidah Umm Ayman رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا.
